

Neumayr from Argentina: "Why Pope Francis Hasn't Visited Argentina"

Catholic investigative journalist <u>George Neumayr</u>, who has contributed a front-page article to CFN's forthcoming September issue (sent to press today), is currently in Buenos Aires, Argentina "to learn about its not-so-favorite son, Jorge Bergoglio," as he explains in his preliminary report published by The American Spectator.
