Nevertheless, He came at the fullness of time [Gal. 4:4], and to those who were searching for Him [on the eve of His Passion], He said, 'I am He' [John 18:5]. Whatever He does is profitable for men, and was not fitting in any other way; and whatever is profitable and fitting, for this He makes provision." (*Discourses Against the Arians*, <u>Book 2, 68</u>)

Just as God the Father sent His Son into the world at a precise moment in history, so too did He ordain that we should live at this particular time, in order to witness to His Truth and help as many souls as possible enter "into the Kingdom of the Son of His love" (Col. 1:13) – the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church.
