


We are excited to announce that *Catholic Family News* has a new and improved e-edition of our monthly paper! Hosted by a digital magazine platform called [Zinio](https://www.zinio.com), the CFN E-Edition is now more versatile and user friendly than ever.

All pre-existing subscribers (those who had an active subscription prior to the change) should have received an email with instructions on how to register on Zinio and access the new e-edition.


To help subscribers navigate the new platform, we will briefly go through the instructions and provide screenshots for your convenience.

**Step #1:** Visit <https://www.zinio.com/sign-in> and click on “Register here”:

**Step #2:** Enter your email address (the same address you entered when purchasing your CFN subscription), create a password, then click on “Register”:



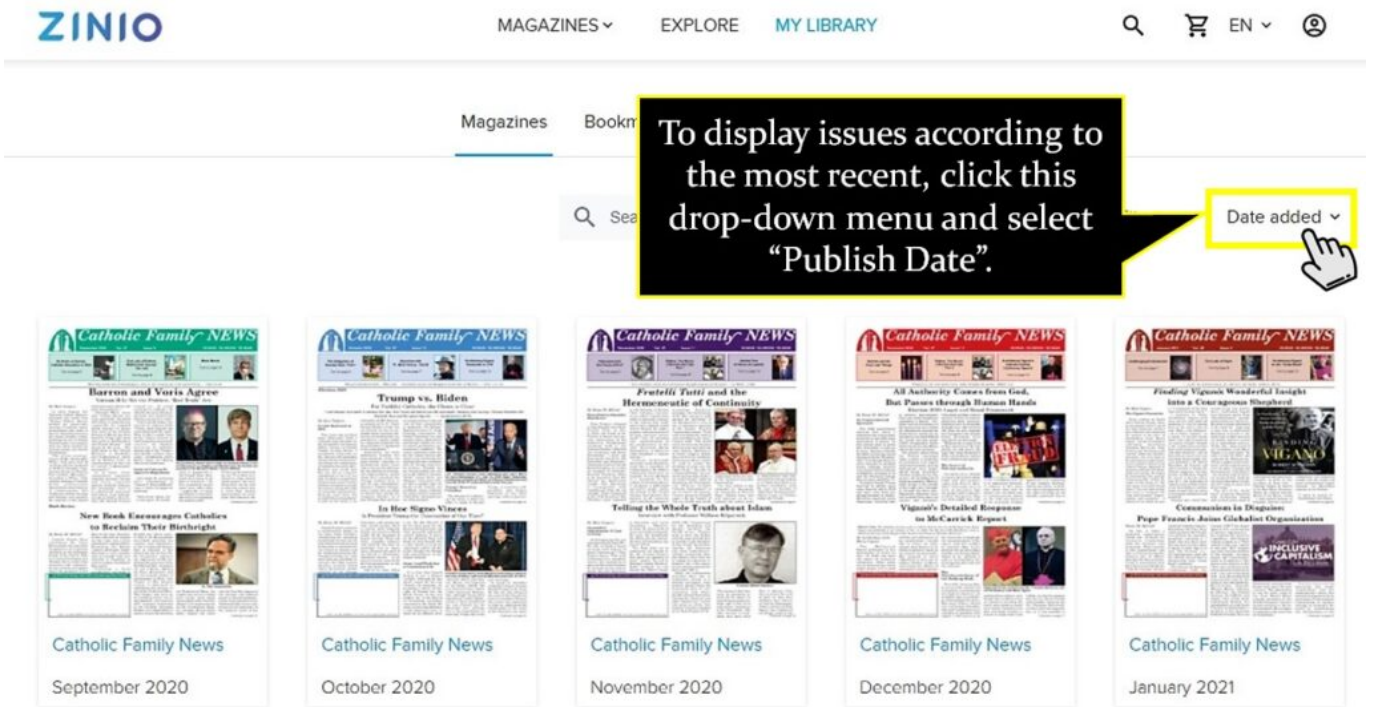

**Step #3:** After you have registered, you will be redirected to the Zinio home page. Once there, click on the "My Library" tab:

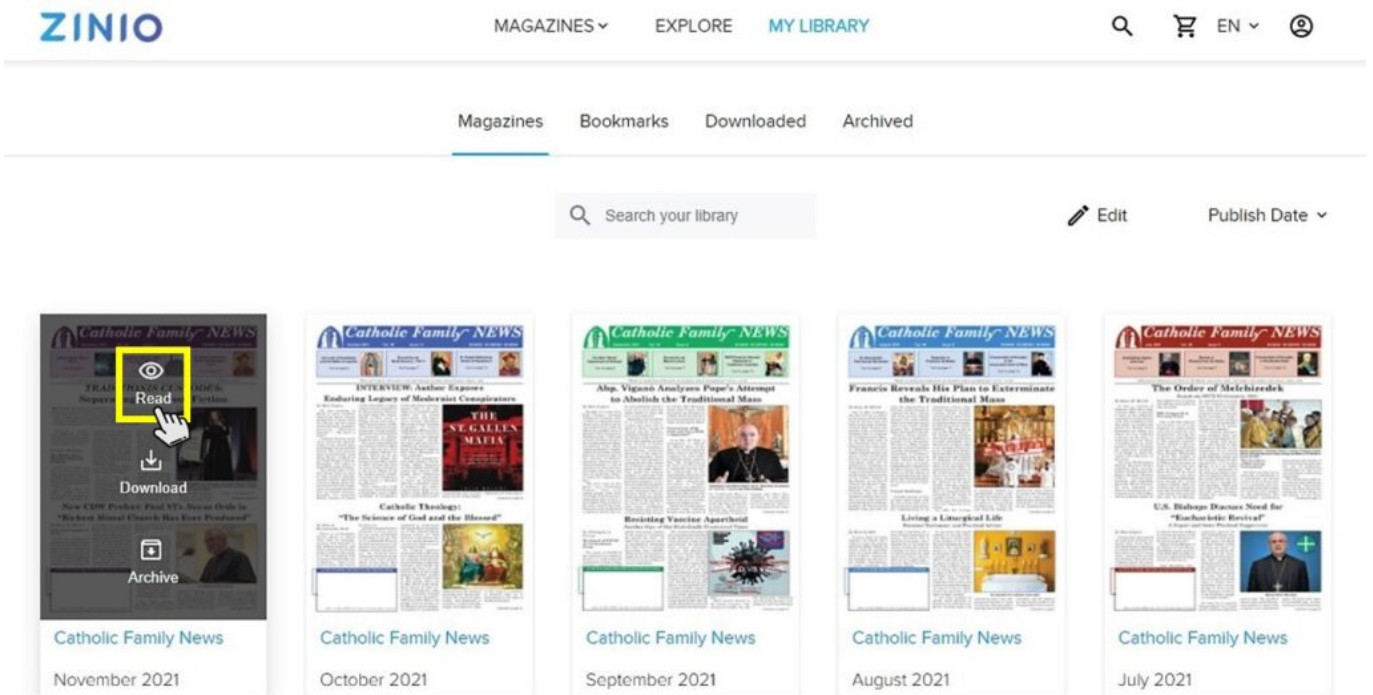


**Step #4:** Congratulations, you now have access to the CFN E-Edition!

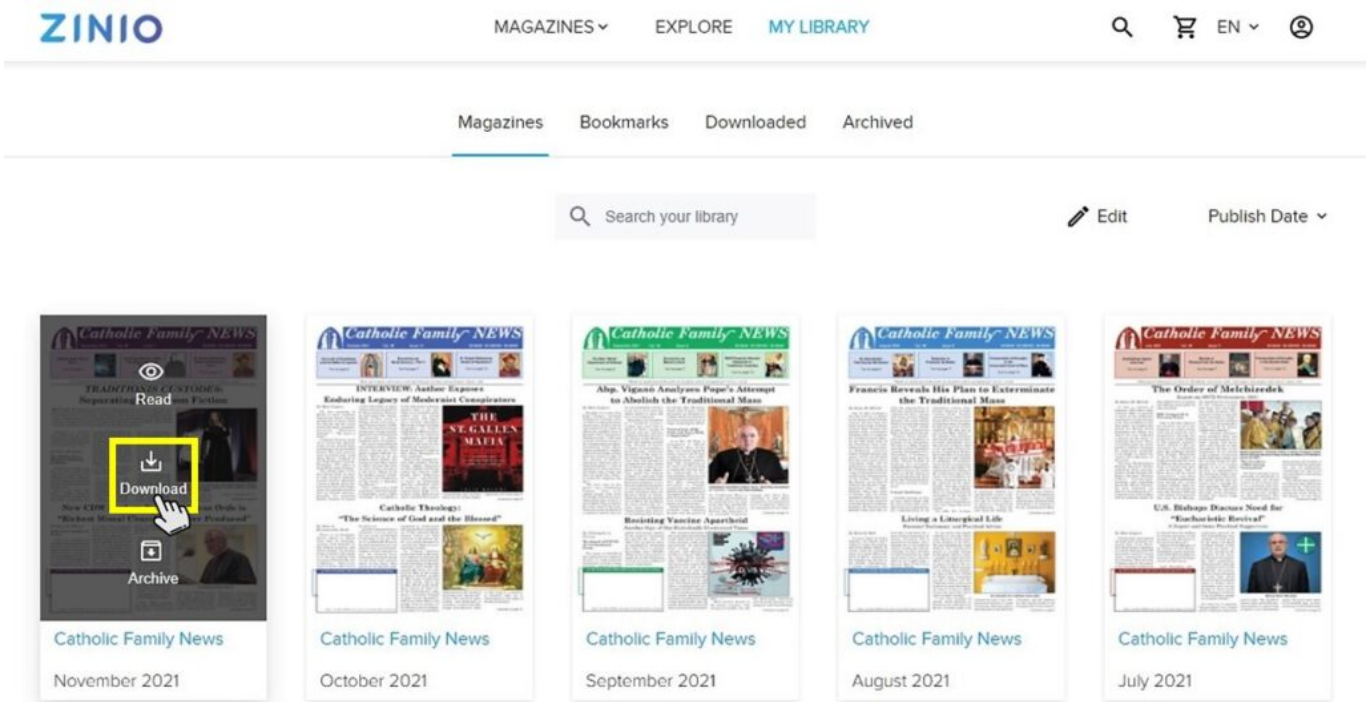
