Month of the Most Holy Name of Jesus

Dear Friends of Catholic Tradition,

We live in a world in which the most sacred things are treated with casual disregard. Within the bounds of prudence, do we object to the profanation or neglect of the Holy Name of Our Savior by those around us? We can with charity and gentleness make it known to those with whom we work or meet that we do not appreciate the disregard or disrespect shown to Our Lord's Name. We have made some important changes to the maintenance and hosting of our subscription database and [online e-edition platform](#). We hope these changes will avoid some of the interruptions and will make it easier to subscribe to and read the paper. If you experienced problems with your subscription as a result, we are deeply sorry.

Subscriptions are our main source of funding the apostolate, including all of our free content that we use to reach the growing number of people whose eyes have been opened by the totalitarian measures in the name of COVID and Pope Francis' increasing dictatorial persecution of Tradition and even rational thought.

You can greatly help us in two important ways. First, we cannot afford to pay to promote our

free content, video and audio podcasts, and online articles. We cannot afford to buy subscribers.
