You can't say Kamala Harris wasn't warned. Not only did Donald Trump but so did Cardinal Dolan predict that if she skipped the Al Smith Dinner, she just might lose in a landslide.

Aside from posting explicitly Catholic content on his social media accounts (he wished Our Lady "Happy Birthday" on September 8), Trump repeatedly brought up the FBI's spying on Latin Mass churches on the campaign trail. His running mate ID Vance also wisely wrote an op-ed for the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette two weeks before the election that recalled all the other ways Harris has targeted Catholics, most notably her attacking a judicial nominee in 2018 who belonged to the Knights of Columbus.

Catholics who sat out this election made a mistake. Multiple clergy, as well as lay writers, have pointed out that Catholic moral teaching holds that if there is a reasonable hope that a greater evil can be avoided by voting for a particular candidate, then that is what must be done. What is worse is that over 40% of Catholics actively supported and voted for the proabortion, pro-LGBTQ agenda candidate. While Trump won the Catholic vote decisively, the substantial number of Catholics who voted for Harris shows the massive failure of

The argument against Trump that some Trads seemed to make is that he is actually worse than Harris because he is a pro-vaccine trojan horse who is owned by Zionists.
