### Leaked Letter Reveals Bishop of Charlotte Wants to Mandate His Personal Fetishes



In May the Bishop of the Diocese of Charlotte decided to cancel all Traditional Masses in his parishes and relegate 1,000 faithful regularly attend to a former Protestant worship space that seats about 300. This assault on faithful Catholics made headlines around the country. Fortunately, and unexplainedly Bishop Martin granted a reprieve to his decision that was to take effect July 1, giving the priest and faithful until October. Bishop Martin's defense to such a persecution was one of obeying orders." He claimed he had to take this decision due to Traditionis Custodes. Yet, his predecessor had requested and received permission to continue the parochial Traditional es through October of 2025. Bishop Martin did not publicly claim that he tried to enew that permission and was denied. He simply stated the

coming to an end.

Yet, a draft letter that
Rorate Caeli obtained from
what it deemed to be a reliable source<sup>1</sup> offers greater insight into the mind of Bishop Martin. The letter which Rorate claims is scheduled to be made public in the future is not about the Traditional Mass but rather the Mass of Paul VI, the Novus Ordo. The letter claims to make sweeping changes to the way the New Mass is to he celebrated in the diocese. the Diocese of Charlotte, under Bishop Martin's predecessor, was one of the best examples of a case study of what Benedict XVI hoped to achieve with Summorum Pontificum. Although we at CFN have criticized the goals of Benedict XVI, it is clear that the prior Bishop of Charlotte embraced those goals and implemented them. First, the offering of the Traditional Mass was widespread in the diocese. Priests were free to offer it

Pontificum and several did so with organic communities developing within parishes which regularly offered the Traditional Mass as an option alongside the Novus Ordo. This side by side offering of Old and New clearly had one of the effects that Benedict sought the mutual enrichment of what he called the "two forms" of the Roman Rite. Vet. since there is nothing really enriching in the New Mass in practice this meant the enrich the New Mass as celebrated in practice. Churches were restored to a more traditional architecture. Communion was distributed in many parts of the diocese at altar rails. There was a reduction in the use of lay "extraordinary" ministers of the Eucharist. Priests began reusing traditional looking vestments (Roman style) and adding back the maniple and amice. More Gregorian chant and polyphony could be heard. Some priests offered even the

New Mass ad orientem. Some priests restored candles and the crucifix to the altar. What effects followed? Beyond more faithful attending the Traditional Mass, the



# The Detroit Latin Mass Shutdown

We are seeing a recurring theme with these shutdowns. This issue is not focused only on the Latin Mass but also on the faith and the idea of liturgy itself. This is why we not only see Novus Ordo ad orientem also restricted.



The following, though unrelated to TC, nevertheless treat Divine Worship and are added to these norms for observance.

- H. Motivated by a unity proper for the Catholic community across the Archdiocese in our divine worship of God, use of the ad orientem posture by the priest when using the ordinary form of the Mass is no longer permitted and the Mass must be celebrated on a freestanding altar. If a permanent free standing altar is not already installed in the parish church it shall be installed no later than 180 days from the promulgation of these norms unless a dispensation for extension of time by which to erect a free standing altar is approved by the Archbishop of Detroit or a local Ordinary acting on his behalf.
- When celebrating the ordinary form of the Mass or any of the Church's prescribed liturgies, no cleric or lay person may add, omit, or alter anything in the ordinary form of the Mass on his own authority (cf., canon 846), so that "the truth of the faith as celebrated might appear ever more in all its beauty" and "how the reformed liturgy is the witness to an unchanged faith, the expression of a renewed ecclesiology, and the primary source of spirituality for Christian life" (Responsa).

The Traditionalists won the battle of ideas in the Liturgy Wars. The tactics have changed. Rather than this being about the merits of the liturgical reform, this about a blind obedience. "Go to your local parish! Submit to the Bishop!" we hear constantly on the internet. What was supposed to be a reform to emphasize active participation has turned the mass into a legalistic act of obsequence, equivalent to a puppet king paying tribute to the emperor. Growth in the spiritual life, attachment to the traditions of the past that made the Saints holy, all of the richness of the ancient cultural and liturgical texts, none of it matters! This can't be what Catholicism is meant to be.

# The Burning Babe

As I in hoary winter's night stood shivering in the snow, Surpris'd I was with sudden heat which made my heart to glow; And lifting up a fearful eye to view what fire was near, A pretty Babe all burning bright did in the air appear; Who, scorched with excessive heat, such floods of tears did shed As though his floods should quench his flames which with his tears were fed. "Alas!" quoth he, "but newly born, in fiery heats I fry, Yet none approach to warm their hearts or feel my fire but I! My faultless breast the furnace is, the fuel wounding thorns, Love is the fire, and sighs the smoke, the ashes shame and scorns; The fuel Justice layeth on, and Mercy blows the coals, The metal in this furnace wrought are men's defiled souls, For which, as now on fire I am to work them to their good, So will I melt into a bath to wash them in my blood." With this he vanish'd out of sight and swiftly shrunk away, And straight I called unto mind that it was Christmas day.

St. Southwell's poem "The Burning Babe" in many ways encapsulates the spirit of much of his writing, especially regarding the use of contrast and paradox. But I also think that Southwell manages to touch on Catholic doctrine, contrasting with Protestant doctrine, that is demonstrated clearly and yet tastefully. Beginning with the meter, I think there is some Christological significance to it, although we should be cautious to not jump to any conclusions. The poem is composed of what contain lines known as "long fourteeners", lines of iambic heptameter (7 Iambic feet) dividing fourteen syllables with a caesura after the 8th



caesura. Each one of the fourteen syllable lines are themsleves a part of a couplet. I find it interesting that the seven syllables are themselves a part of this greater couplet, as what immediately comes to mind is the 7 Sacraments stemming from the Incarnation, the Hypostatic Union of Christ's human and divine natures.
